BOHEMIAN NIGHTS ANNOUNCES TWO CONCERTS AT THE ARMORY FEATURING GREGORY ALAN ISAKOV AND TRACE BUNDY WITH STEVE POLTZ

FORT COLLINS, Colo., January 12, 2017 – Bohemian Nights today announced two upcoming Armory concerts. A Jan. 28 concert will feature Gregory Alan Isakov and local supporting artist Natalie Tate. On Feb. 15, Trace Bundy and Steve Poltz will co-headline with no opener.

[Concerts at the Armory](#) are held in Fort Collins' historic Armory building, 314 E. Mountain Ave. Doors open at 6 p.m., and concerts begin at 7 p.m. Concerts are open to all ages. Light snacks and beverages will be available for purchase. Tickets are \$35 for the Gregory Alan Isakov show and \$20 for the Trace Bundy and Steve Poltz show. About Jan. 28 headliner Gregory Alan Isakov

Born in Johannesburg, South Africa, and calling Colorado home, Gregory Alan Isakov has been traveling all his life. His songs tell a story of miles and landscapes and the search for a sense of place. His song-craft shows hints of his influences, Leonard Cohen and Bruce Springsteen. He has been described as "strong, subtle, a lyrical genius." In summer of 2016, Isakov released an album of his songs played in collaboration with the Colorado Symphony.

About Jan. 28 supporting artist Natalie Tate

Natalie Tate's music merges the roots sensibilities of her Colorado home with the planes of a more ethereal land. Tate has performed nationally at festivals including Daytrotter Downs, Mile of Music, San Diego Music Thing and Summer Solstice Music Festival, sharing stages along the way with Gregory Alan Isakov, Pure Bathing Culture, Futurebirds, the Cave Singers and more. Alongside a rotating cast of collaborators including members of Denver's the Still Tide, Inner Oceans and Chimney Choir, Tate has been featured locally at Westword Music and Denver Post Underground Music Showcases as well as on Colorado Public Radio's Open Air Performance Sessions. Tate was voted Denver's Best Singer-Songwriter in the 2016 Denver Westword Music Awards. Tate recently released a beat-driven EP, "Your Type."

About Feb. 15 artists Trace Bundy and Steve Poltz (co-headliners, no opener)

Internationally-acclaimed guitar virtuoso Trace Bundy uses harmonics, looping, multiple capos, and his unique banter and stage presence to deliver an unforgettable live concert experience. Bundy's unique career has brought him across the world, with concerts in 28 countries and counting; from high-tech performance halls in South Korea and Italy, to remote villages in Zimbabwe and Guatemala. He has independently sold more than 110,000 albums on his record label, Honest Ninja Music. Bundy has acquired more than 36,000,000 YouTube views to date.

As a recording artist, Steve Poltz fronted the Rugburns and is responsible for a critically lauded body of work on his own: "One Left Shoe," "Chinese Vacation," "Answering Machine," "The Barn," "Tales From The Tavern," "Traveling," "Unraveling," "Dreamhouse," "Noineen Noiny Noin" and most recently the soundtrack for the acclaimed Sundance-screened documentary film, "Running Wild - The Life of Dayton O. Hyde." Poltz also co-wrote "You Were Meant For Me" with Jewel.

Poltz and Bundy will co-headline the concert with Poltz performing first.

About Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory

[Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory](#) is a year-round ticketed concert series bringing local and national artists together to perform at Fort Collins' historic Armory building at 314 E. Mountain Ave. The series aims to add to Fort Collins' variety of live music offerings; to provide a high-quality listening experience in an intimate environment that emphasizes the connection between audience members and performers; and to offer local performers opportunities to build relationships with nationally known artists.

Since its construction in 1907, Fort Collins' historic Armory building has functioned as a space for public gathering and entertainment. The building served as the community's first permanent National Guard Armory, housing about 60 National Guardsmen. Its drill hall doubled as a public hall for Northern Colorado's social and civic events. When a new armory was built on College Avenue in 1922, the building was vacated by the National Guard. Since then, the Armory building on Mountain Avenue has served the community in various ways, including as a roller skating rink, a laundry, a meeting hall, office and retail space, and now as a music venue.

[Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory](#) is part of Bohemian Nights' many music offerings, which also include [Bohemian Nights Presents Thursday Night Live](#), a free weekly summer concert series, and [Bohemian Nights at NewWestFest](#), a free annual music festival slated for Aug. 11, 12 and 13, 2017 in downtown Fort Collins.
