Local artist Rebecca Folsom will open

FORT COLLINS, Colo., Feb. 1, 2016—[Bohemian Nights](#) announced today that singer-songwriter [Karla Bonoff](#) and local artist [Rebecca Folsom](#) will perform at a concert on March 3 at the historic Fort Collins Armory.

Each [Concert at the Armory](#) pairs a local Colorado artist with a nationally-known artist for an intimate performance in Fort Collins' historic Armory building, 314 E. Mountain Ave. Doors open at 6 p.m., and the concert begins at 7 p.m. The concert is open to all ages. Light snacks and beverages will be available for purchase. #### About headliner Karla Bonoff

Karla Bonoff has been described as one of the finest singer-songwriters of her generation. With a career spanning four decades, she has enjoyed critical acclaim, commercial success, enduring popularity and unwavering respect from her peers. Her songs have been performed by artists Bonnie Raitt, Wynonna Judd and Linda Ronstadt, and many of her ballads are classics.

In 2007, Bonoff produced a live album which included some of her most popular material ("All My Life," "Someone to Lay Down Beside Me," "Tell Me Why" and "Lose Again"), along with two new compositions. Like her performances, the instrumentation on the album is clean and spare, giving Bonoff's voice room to work its emotional magic. "Karla Bonoff Live" is her first solo album since 1999, when she released "All My Life: The Best of Karla Bonoff."

Bonoff's 2015 release, "Looking into You: A Tribute to Jackson Browne," features covers of Browne's songs, with fellow artists Don Henley, Bonnie Raitt, Indigo Girls, David Lindley, Lyle Lovett, Keb Mo, Lucinda Williams, Shawn Colvin and Bruce Springsteen.

#### About opener Rebecca Folsom

Rebecca Folsom's near four-octave range earns her a respectable seat at the table with vocalists Whitney Houston and Queen's Freddie Mercury. Add in the soulfulness of Etta James, the abandon of Janis Joplin, a touch of folk songstress Joni Mitchell and that is Folsom.

Folsom has performed on BBC radio and television in Northern Ireland; on Nashville's Bluebird, Opryland, and Tin Pan South stages; at New York's Bitterend and Falcon Ridge Music Festival; at the Kerrville Folk Festival in Texas; and at Colorado's own Rocky Mountain Folks Festival and Red Rocks Amphitheatre.

Her latest CD, "Reunion," which Boulder Magazine describes as "achingly beautiful," is a fusion of songs, paintings and poetry that rushed forth after a two-year period deep in the realm of shadows and healing. "Reunion" brings her full circle, masterfully reflecting the trinity of her life's work as a singer-songwriter, an artist with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree, and an author with two published books of poetry. In addition to an extensive performance schedule, Folsom teaches songwriting and vocal workshops.

About Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory

[Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory](#) is a year-round ticketed concert series bringing local and national artists together to perform at Fort Collins' historic Armory building at 314 E. Mountain Ave. The series aims to add to Fort Collins' variety of live music offerings; to provide a high-quality listening experience in an intimate environment that emphasizes the connection between audience members and performers; and to offer local performers opportunities to build relationships with nationally-known artists.

Since its construction in 1907, Fort Collins' historic Armory building has functioned as a space for public gathering and entertainment. The building served as the community's first permanent National Guard Armory, housing about 60 National Guardsmen. Its drill hall doubled as a public hall for Northern Colorado's social and civic events. When a new armory was built on College Avenue in 1922, the building was vacated by the National Guard. Since then, the Armory building on Mountain Avenue has served the community in various ways, including as a roller skating rink, a laundry, a meeting hall, office and retail space, and now as a music venue.

[Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory](#) is part of Bohemian Nights' many music offerings, which also include [Bohemian Nights Presents Thursday Night Live](#), a free weekly summer concert series, and [Bohemian Nights at NewWestFest](#), a free annual music festival slated for Aug. 12, 13 and 14, 2016 in downtown Fort Collins.
