BOHEMIAN NIGHTS ANNOUNCES TWO ARMORY CONCERTS IN JUNE

FORT COLLINS, Colo., April 20, 2017 – Bohemian Nights today announced two upcoming concerts at the historic Fort Collins Armory. On June 7, critically acclaimed folk group Langhorne Slim & the Law will perform; on June 15, country singer-songwriter Kasey Chambers will perform.

Each [Concert at the Armory](#) pairs a local Colorado artist with a nationally known artist for an intimate performance in Fort Collins' historic Armory building, 314 E. Mountain Ave. Doors open at 6 p.m., and the concert begins at 7 p.m. The concert is open to all ages. Light snacks and beverages will be available for purchase. Tickets for Langhorne Slim & the Law are \$18 in advance or \$20 the day of the show; tickets for Kasey Chambers are \$30. About June 7 headliner Langhorne Slim & the Law

Langhorne Slim released "The Spirit Moves" in 2015, an effervescent collection of Langhorne Slim's now-signature sound rooted in folk, soul and blues. Out on Dualtone Records, the album marked his second with rock-solid band The Law, and provided a highly anticipated and well-received follow-up to 2012's critically acclaimed "The Way We Move." The record delights in contradiction: freewheeling but purposeful; celebratory but confessional; looking to light even when it's dark. Langhorne Slim's voice, described as "an arresting howl sublimely at home in a Mississippi roadhouse or on a Newport stage," has never sounded better.

Langhorne Slim & the Law is Langhorne Slim (vocals/guitar), Malachi DeLorenzo (drums), Jeff Ratner (bass) and Casey McAllister (keys).

About June 15 headliner Kasey Chambers

Australian country musician Kasey Chambers is a true storyteller. From the red dust of her nomadic childhood to the surf coast where she's raised her family, her records are a testament to "who [she] was at the time." Her eleventh and newest album, 2017's "Dragonfly," is proof that she's unwilling to settle for anything less.

Born in Mount Gambier, South Australia, Chambers grew up in a home environment where listening to and performing country and roots music was a way of life. It had to rub off—and it did—just as in later years, living on the Nullarbor Plain and traveling all over Australia with her family, the young Chambers got an education like no other. She spent her childhood absorbing the music of Hank Williams, Emmylou Harris, Johnny Cash and other country greats loved by her parents. It was in the family's revered Dead Ringer Band that 10-year-old Chambers got her first real taste of being on stage. By the time she was in her late teens she was fronting the band and writing songs.

Now, decades later, Chambers' music seems buried in Australia's bones. Beyond accolades and album sales, there's something immutable about Kasey Chambers, something that makes her as

vital to the music landscape as the red rock where her music was born.

About Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory

[Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory](#) is a year-round ticketed concert series bringing local and national artists together to perform at Fort Collins' historic Armory building at 314 E. Mountain Ave. The series aims to add to Fort Collins' variety of live music offerings; to provide a high-quality listening experience in an intimate environment that emphasizes the connection between audience members and performers; and to offer local performers opportunities to build relationships with nationally known artists.

Since its construction in 1907, Fort Collins' historic Armory building has functioned as a space for public gathering and entertainment. The building served as the community's first permanent National Guard Armory, housing about 60 National Guardsmen. Its drill hall doubled as a public hall for Northern Colorado's social and civic events. When a new armory was built on College Avenue in 1922, the building was vacated by the National Guard. Since then, the Armory building on Mountain Avenue has served the community in various ways, including as a roller skating rink, a laundry, a meeting hall, office and retail space, and now as a music venue.

[Bohemian Nights Presents Concerts at the Armory](#) is part of Bohemian Nights' many music offerings, which also include [Bohemian Nights Presents Thursday Night Live](#), a free weekly summer concert series, and [Bohemian Nights at NewWestFest](#), a free annual music festival slated for Aug. 11, 12 and 13, 2017 in downtown Fort Collins.
